
Gender Sensitisation Programmes of the Institution

The institution caters to imparting a sense of gender inclusiveness among the student community through various curricular and co-curricular initiatives. 'NAAM' (a Malayalam word suggestive of inclusiveness) is an institution-specific gender sensitization forum. The institution also observes days and events of national and international importance to create awareness and promote gender equality.



Gender Sensitisation in Curricular Aspects:

- The institution offers **44 courses** that address gender-related issues like human rights, equity, discrimination, and domestic violence.
- The institution conducts regular Gender Audit of students, teachers and non-teaching staff.
 - > Out of the 42 permanent faculties, **more than 70 per cent** are women.
 - ➤ Out of the 22 non-teaching staff, more than 30 per cent are women.



The meeting held in the auditorium was presided over by Principal Dr. Lata Marina Varghese. Dr. Asha s delivered a talk on "*Women –The architect of society*". 






NAAM SERIES II

Report on International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women





Objectives:


- To take effective measures for the safety and security of all genders





The graph on the gender-wise distribution of teaching staff provides the information that over the period of five years, the percentage of male teachers has increased from 16% to 26% of the total teaching staff. However, there was a marginal decrease of 10% in the number of female teachers.

The graph on the gender-wise distribution of non-teaching staff reveals that there was a considerable decrease in the percentage of male staff from 88% to 68% of the total. Nevertheless, there was a noticeable increase in the number of female staff by 20%.
